

MARCH GOLF CLUB – DRESS CODE

The Club wishes to see all members and guests smartly dressed at all times while on Club premises.

“Smartly dressed” means different things to different people. This Dress Code is not meant to cover all aspects of fashion but it is produced to give firm guidance on what the Club means by “smart”

ON THE COURSE

Men		Ladies
<p>Yes Short or long sleeve shirts with a collar Short or long sleeve tops with polo neck, turtleneck or mock turtleneck</p> <p>But Shirts must be tucked in</p>	<p>Yes Tops with or without sleeves but with a collar, polo neck, turtleneck or mock turtleneck</p> <p>Tops may be worn outside the waistband if they are designed to be so</p>	
	<p>No Shirts with large logos, rugby shirts, football shirts, tee shirts, crop tops</p>	
<p>Yes Trousers or tailored shorts or cropped trousers with belt loops and a hem no more than three inches above the knee</p>	<p>Yes Skirts, skorts, trousers or tailored shorts</p>	
	<p>No Blue Denim, Combat trousers or combat shorts</p> <p>But Trousers must be clean, not torn, not frayed and not tucked into socks</p>	
<p>Yes If wearing shorts or cropped trousers, sports socks or socklets must be worn</p>		
	<p>Yes Golf shoes are preferred but clean trainers may be worn on the course</p> <p>Peaked hats must be worn with the peak to the front</p>	

IF IN DOUBT, DO NOT WEAR IT

IN THE CLUBHOUSE LOUNGE OR DINING ROOM

THE CODE FOR THE COURSE APPLIES

Except

- No external clothing (waterproofs, anoraks, parkas, raincoats, overcoats or similar)
- Shirts need not be tucked in
- Smart blue denim may be worn
- Socks, socklets etc. need not be worn
- Footwear used on the course may not be worn
- No hats

MEALS, FUNCTIONS ETC

For meals after club friendly matches and competitions participants must change from their golf clothes and men must wear jacket and tie but the Captain of the day may vary this part of the code

For competitive matches – Scratch, Grace Norman and the like – as for lounge

Dress code for other “one off” functions will be announced at the same time as the function is announced.

PRACTICE GROUND

The Club is anxious to encourage people into golf and, wishing to place as few barriers in the way of beginners, has no dress code for the practice ground save the underlying principle of “smartness”
